Camp serves those who have a physical or psychological medical condition, any and all types of service and non-service related illnesses, injuries or disabilities. A few 'physical' examples are blindness/vision loss, deafness/hearing loss, fatal/incurable disease, loss of limb/amputees, paralysis/spinal cord injury, permanent disfigurement, severe burns, traumatic brain injury, cancer, stroke, ALS and Parkinson's disease. To help with 'psychological' conditions, Camp assists those with Post Traumatic Stress (PTS), Traumatic Blast Injuries (TBI), Combat Operational Stress (COS), Dementia and Bipolar conditions along with many other related emotional and cultural issues to get them back on the road to health."

This is where we are going to have a meeting on **Sept. 9**th. Mark your calendars and be ready to come up to the beautiful Northwoods.

Our meeting will only be the minor event of the day. The main event will be the opportunity for you to learn in person what the Camp has to offer eligible veterans. We will get a tour of the cabins, a lunch in the main hall, a brief by the manager, and if weather permits a pontoon ride on Lake Tomahawk. The new hiking trail is also available through the forest, get there early and take a hike before the rest of the day's events.

More info will be coming on times and places to stay for those that will need to spend the night.
