

# **Badger State Chapter Meeting Minutes**

July 26, 2008 Farm Kitchen in Baraboo, WI.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Mike Haller at 3:10 P.M. Gerald Diemel confirmed that a quorum was present. The Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer was led by Reuben Clark. Fifteen members and ten guests were present. One of the guests, Lawrence Zink, joined the chapter right after the meeting.

Motion by Frank Morris, 2nd by Tom Gaukel, to approve the minutes of the 5-29-08 meeting held in Watertown. Tom pointed out one correction; the minutes indicated that the chairman and vicechairman will be the delegates from the BSC at the National Convention in St. Louis in August. In fact, Frank and Jim Morris will be the delegates. Noting the correction, the minutes were approved.

Treasurers Report; The balance sheet was distributed by Treasurer, Reuben Clark. He reported that we have taken in about \$1160.00 so far on the sale of challenge coins. John Givens said that 150 coins have been sold, 2 are missing (or were given away) and that leaves 48 coins left for sale. He will be taking them to the National Convention in August. Reuben reported that the care of the flowers for the Memorial Bridge in Stevens Point has been paid for. Frank Morris has been to the monument and said the U.S. flag was tattered, but the Wisconsin flag was OK. (Tom Gaukel reported later that a new U.S. flag has been placed at the Memorial Bridge.) The writing of "AIRBORNE" on the memorial is fading. It is the type of stone that attracts dust. Frank has checked with stone people and he and Jim will be cleaning the stone in the near future. Reuben was asked if he had sent the \$100.00 to the Museum for War on Terrorism at Fort Bragg. He has not, since it was never voted on at a meeting. Reuben reported there are 125 life members and 37 Regulars. Of those 37 regulars, 11 are delinquent. Reuben will personally contact the delinquents. The Treasurers Report will be placed on file.

Secretaries Report; John Givens reminded the members that we have a transient membership and when addresses are changed, please notify John or

Reuben. He also said that in the 82nd Airborne Division Assoc. bulletin that he receives from Fort Bragg, stated it is now acceptable to hand salute the flag at parades etc., even if you are not in the active service.

Vice Chairman's Report; Tom Laney passed out a written report. He said he and Gerald Deimel attended the American Legion Post 75 in Fond du Lac on July 19 when they renamed their building in honor of James "Maggie" Megellas. We discussed building support for the Medal of Honor, bills s-3232 and HR-795. He is working on a website for the BSC.

Chairman's Comments; Mike Haller said how proud he is of the attendance at the meetings. It shows we are paying proper respect to all Airborne, both past and present. He reminded members to send their profile to John Givens for inclusion in the history book he is preparing. He also welcomed the younger members who were at the meeting.

Project Coordinator's Report; Tom Gaukel mentioned that the "Airborne" artist print the BSC is giving to the Veterans Home at King, WI. will be presented to them when our chapter conducts our meeting there on November 8th, or on the 15th. He passed around the plaque that will be put on the frame or under the glass. It reads: Presented by, The BADGER STATE CHAPTER, 82ND ABN. DIV. ASSOC. Mike Haller said it is in the process of being framed. Motion by Tom Gaukel that the chapter send \$100.00 to the Fort Bragg Museum for the War on Terrorism Memorial, 2nd by Frank Morris, motion carried. Tom has not been able to get names of families with children of deceased Airborne. He also questioned the status of Care Packages. Bert Schmitz was handling that but has not been at recent meetings. John Givens will contact him to see if Bert can give us an up to date status report.

Old Business; A) Memorial Bridge Shrub Status: Frank Morris reported that you wouldn't want to put very tall shrubs as they would obscure the view. He and his wife, Marge, suggest that flat shrubs be used. It is too late in the season for planting this year. They will check prices next spring and report back. Frank and Marge will do the planting. Tom Gaukel moved that this matter be tabled until next spring, 2nd by Bill Tobin, motion carried. B) Ripon college "Maggie" project: Tom Laney made a motion that we place a tribute display case (one of two the chapter purchased) at Ripon College in honor of the 82nd Airborne and Jim Megellas. Seconded by John Givens, motion carried. C) Museum display case status: Tom Gaukel has been working with the Wisconsin Veterans Museum in Madison for the placement of the second display case. Other possibilities are King, Tomah, or Milwaukee. Memorabilia is needed for cases. If you have anything to contribute, please contact Tom Gaukel. Ed Moehrke brought a WWII helmet to be placed in the cabinet.

D) King gift picture framing status: Mike Haller is taking care of having it framed.

E) High Ground Recommendation: After considerable discussion, motion by Jim Morris to drop High Ground consideration at the present time. Seconded by Tom Gaukel, motion carried.

F) St. Louis convention van status: Tom Gaukel reported that 16 have signed up. A 15 passenger van will be used and a car. We will leave Baraboo at 9:00 AM. on Thursday, Aug. 14th, and return to Baraboo on Sunday, Aug. 17th.

New Business: A) Next meeting (when/where) following discussion, motion by Tom Gaukel, 2nd by Reuben Clark, that the next meeting be held on Saturday, Sept. 27 in the Eau Claire area. Motion carried. It was suggested that the Executive Committee meet and establish time and places for the meetings in 2009. That way they could be published ahead of time. B) New member campaign: Tom Gaukel suggested that BSC members that belong to an Am. Legion or VFW, or other groups, try to post a note in their newsletters, etc., to inform the membership about our Airborne chapter. C) Meeting ideas? (What do members want?): Young member, Kipp Hartman suggested an "Airborne Day at the Dells" next summer and use it as a promotional. Another young member present at the meeting, Bob Phillips, displayed an incredible treasure of Airborne historical items including actual combat maps. Bob will also be helping Tom Laney with the BSC website.

Members Comments; Lawrence Zink, Baraboo, a guest who joined the chapter right after the meeting, addressed our members. He was a 20 year combat vet of the 82nd, Rangers and Special Forces. He has 875 jumps!!!! Thank you Larry, welcome to the chapter, and thank you Mike Haller for recruiting him.

Rick Whalen has a 2 year old German Shepard named "Bear" and they go out and visit veterans in the hospital in Milwaukee.

The BSC secretary, John Givens was asked to send a Get Well Card to Les Schwarm.

Tom Gaukel suggests that members call other members in their area and ask them to attend the next meeting, perhaps you can car pool. The next newsletter will have a membership list included by area

Kipp Hartman reported that Mike Brennan, father of fallen Josh Brennan, is helping put together a "Welcome Home 173rd Sky Soldiers" party. The party will be held at the 173rd's base, Camp Ederle in Vicenza, Italy. This will require a large amount of money.

Motion by Reuben Clark that the proceeds from the raffle at the meeting be given to this cause. Seconded by Frank Morris, motion carried. Motion by Tom Laney seconded by Bill Tobin, that the chapter donate \$200.00 and encourage our members to purchase a T-shirt (being sold to raise funds). Motion carried.

Tom Laney presented a letter, (with proper requirements) requesting Jim "Maggie" Megellas be made an Honorary Member of the BSC. Seconded by John Givens, motion carried.

Gerald Diemel reported that there are BSC jackets available for purchase.
