Gordy Starck to Receive Vets Honor August 20!

"Many of our honorees have been WWII Veterans but we've never had anyone with the combat experience Gordy has. I can't imagine jumping out of an airplane once. To do it four times under fire is incredible", said Vets Rep Pete Moran, Superior.

"Please let your Chapter members know they are welcome to attend the honor," Moran said.

A Board of Veterans Affairs subcommittee consisting of three Board members including Pete, selected Gordy Starck to receive the prestigious Wisconsin Veterans Service Award

Lots of 505 Paratroopers made it home from WWII because of fearless medics like Gordy. He joined the 82nd in N. Africa and saved 505 PIR men *All The Way* to Berlin. He endured the four combat jumps, a cracked back, a bayonet slash,

"Many of our honorees have WWII Veterans but we've had anyone with the comexperience Gordy has. I can't the 82nd's battles in Sicily, Italy, France, Holland, Belgium and Germany and came home to be a civic, labor and Catholic leader.

Gordy was a city councilman and Mayor of Franklin. He's a rabid Brewer/Packer fan and one of those great people who make this world a better place. Ditto for Margie his Trooper wife.

This award was initiated by Paratrooper Col. John Scocos, the former Secretary of Wisconsin's Veterans Affairs and Gordy will be the first Paratrooper to receive it.

The award's selection criteria focus on the nominee's lifetime achievements in the military, in veterans' affairs, and as a citizen in service to his/her hometown, the State of Wisconsin and the United States of America.

Major General Curtis Scaparrotti, Commander of the famed 82nd Airborne Division, is not waiting for the President or Congress to further honor our Division's most decorated officer.

The 82nd Airborne's All Americans, assembled for the Division's change of command August 5, hosted Jim "Maggie" Megellas and wife Carole, formerly of Fond du Lac, to award Maggie the Army's "Superior Civilian Service Award".

In the past few months Maggie has received highest honors from the Texas DAR; the National DAR; the Greek AHEPA Freedom Medal; and now the highest award Major General Scaparrotti can give him.

Back here on the ranch we are waiting to hear from Senator Russ Feingold on the reintroduction of Senate/House Bills to finally award Maggie the Medal of Honor for which the 82nd recommended him in 1945. A Maggie update letter is going to the 82nd Convention and a Facebook petition is in the works. This medal would honor all Airborne!



BSC flies new flags for Airborne Forces

Wisconsin must have a ton of Warriors for Veterans to let the Veterans Affairs Board fire a man like Col. John Scocos.

The former Secretary of Wisconsin's Veterans Affairs came all the way from Washington with two of his sons to address our little BSC group, assembled July 31 in celebration of new flags and honor of the Troopers who have gone before us.

John Scocos is a man in The Good Fight. He spends his life fighting for Veterans, Veterans of ALL the wars. He talked to us about how important it is these days especially to care for the wounded who are coming home from Iraq and Afghanistan—to fight for the funding to give these Soldiers, Sailors, Fliers and Ma-

rines the care some of them will require for the rest of their lives.

"I looked in his eyes and I knew right away that he is a good man," said BSC member Marge Morris. "He cares, and that is what our wounded Veterans need, a leader who cares and will fight for them."

Nevertheless, a new Veterans Board fired

Scocos for what they said was his lack of accountability, two months after he returned from his second deployment to Iraq! We need to be going *All The Way* for this leader!

The occasion was spurred by Gerry and Bev Diemel and Frank and Marge Morris who have spent 100s of hours not only sprucing up the Airborne Forces Memorial site but getting two new flag poles installed. We were honored to have Col. Scocos as well as the Plover VFW Post 10262 Honor Guard, a prayer by Lester Schwarm, a Goosebumps speech by VFW Post 10262 Commander and Special Forces Vet John "Trapper" Schultz on the Airborne Elite; Paratrooper Jim Romlein who chairs the 101st's Old Abe Chapter and made stirring remarks about his Chapter's Eagle Feather and Old Abe; WWII Glider Rider Walter Pakulski who described the work to get the Airborne Memorial.

Following the flag dedication we adjourned to the Blue Top for refreshments and dinner.

Liz decided to spend her 39th birthday with us so we gave her a cake and sang Happy Birthday to her. Then Frank presented Reuben

with BSC thanks for all he and Liz have done for the Chapter.
